rtistic Director Javier Dzul has one of the most impressive and exotic résumés in modern dance. He grew up in the jungles of Yucatán, the last king of a remote Mayan tribe. Mayan ritual dance was in his blood. Dzul left his home at 16 to study and dance professionally with Ballet Folkorico de Mexico and the National Ballets of Mexico and Cuba. Martha Graham brought him to the U.S. Since arriving in New York City, he has performed with the Martha Graham Dance Company and Alvin Ailey Repertory Ensemble, among others.
